

Recording Skype sessions as Evidence

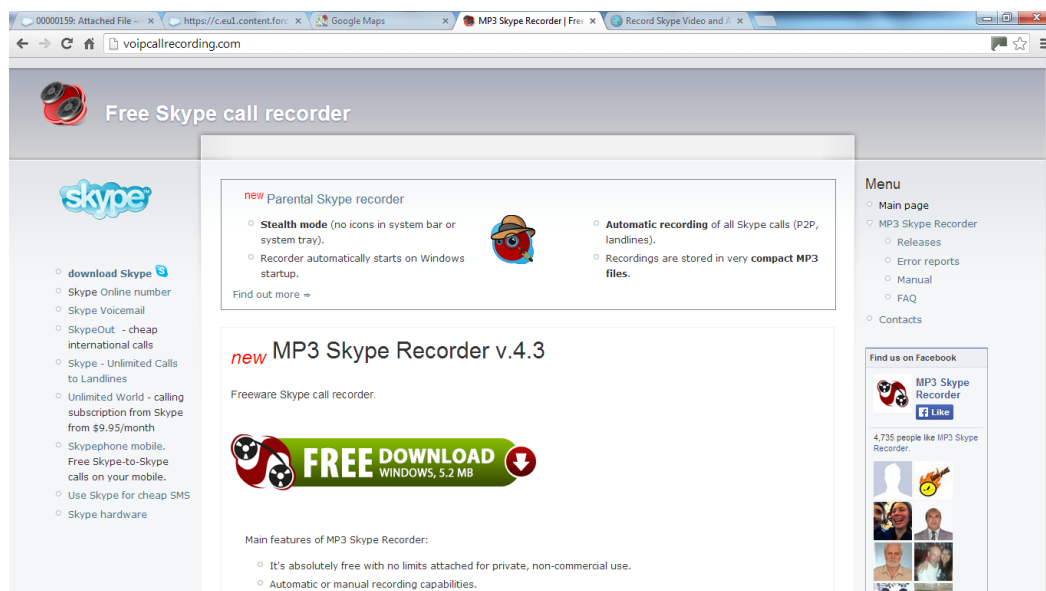
Very good quality evidence can be created when using an interface such as Skype. Voice can be recorded, as can images of either people, or documents.

Skype requires a piece of add-on software in order to record successfully. There are various options available, most are free of charge for use with audio, or are available for a small fee for use with video too.

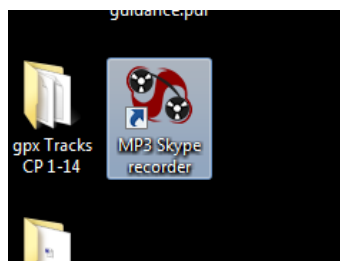

The **MP3 Skype Recorder** is a good example of a voice recorder and it's free of charge. You can access it at **www.voipcallrecording.com**

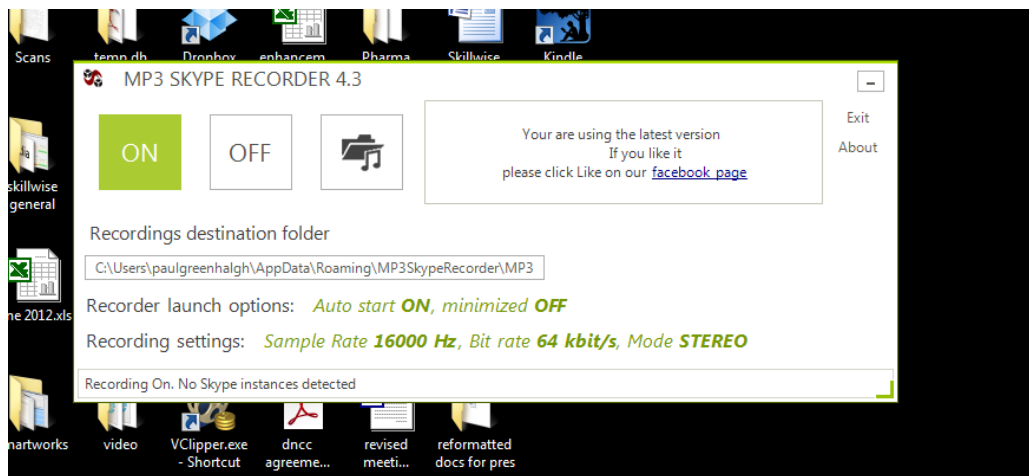


It's a straightforward download...

...and generates an icon on your home page.



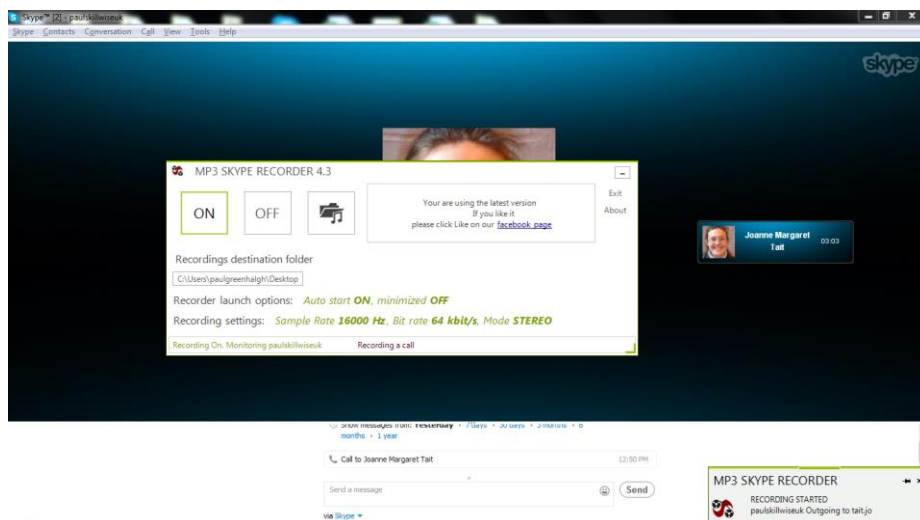
Launching it allows you to set certain preferences, for example you can choose the folder where your recordings will be automatically stored. Note that in the image below, it has been set to auto-start.



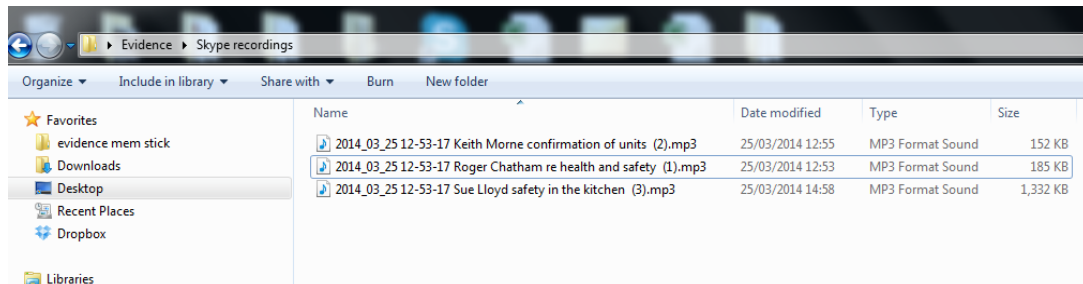
When you want to run a Skype session, simply start Skype as usual



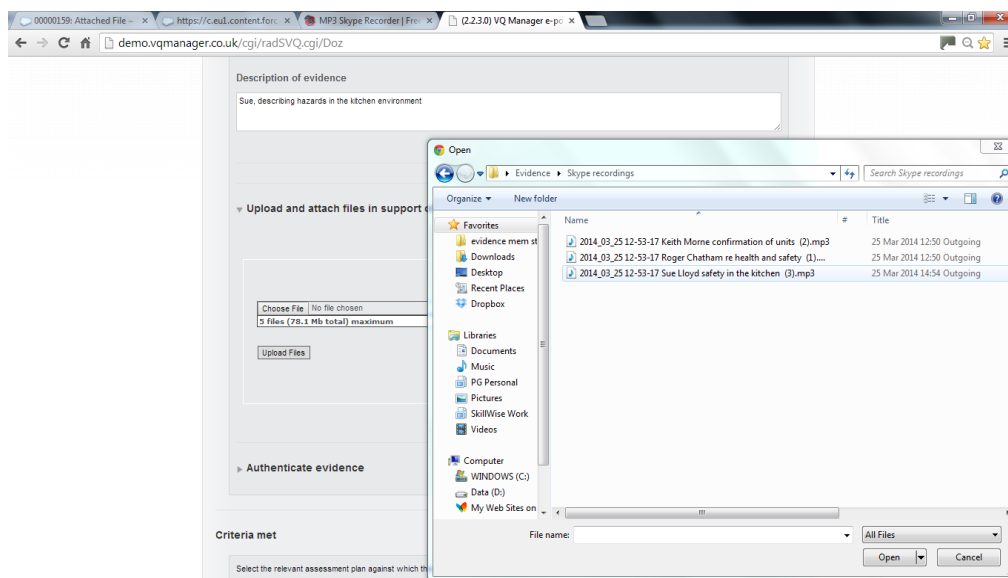
If you are presented with the MP3 Skype Recorder pop-up box you can click on 'ON' – but after the first occasion you will not normally see this pop-up again, the recording simply auto-starts.



At the end of the session, you will see a small dialogue box confirming that it recorded successfully. You will also be able to select the recording from whichever folder you designated earlier. Here, you can rename it re-file it, or...



... attach it as evidence in VQManager.
