When we deploy VQM we can recommend certain browsers that allow these accessibility functions, and VQM has been built in such a way that it works well with these current off the shelf accessibility tools. An example is a screen reader (such as within Google Chrome). In VQM screens there is actual text that the screen readers can interpret, rather than *images* of text, which they can't.
